## Annual meeting and Workshop:

2018 marks the 18<sup>th</sup> annual Intertribal Nursery Council (INC) meeting. We are pleased to announce this year's gathering will be hosted by the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes. The event will be held **24-26 July, in Boise, Idaho**.

## Tour and Dinner

Tours are slated for the agenda and will include a visit to a local restoration site and US Forest Service Lucky Peak Nursery on Tuesday and a visit to the Shoshone-Paiute Native Plant Nursery on Wednesday. We are planning a traditional-style dinner from the host tribe on Wednesday evening. Details for both the tours and dinner will be announced soon.

## Workshop

This year we will be having a small workshop on the last day of the meeting (Thursday, 26 July). The major theme of the workshop is: Producing Native Plants in Response to Climate Change-Induced Drought. While the topics will be focused on local, regional species and issues, the theory will have broad application. Topics will be on community science, seed zones, nursery practices, adaptive genetics, and demonstration projects.

## Travel Grants

The USDA Forest Service has secured grant money to help pay travel and registration costs for individuals attending the INC nursery meeting. A **limited number** of grants are available and will be awarded to students and tribes with limited or no travel funds. Priority will be given to those tribes that have nurseries, or are in the planning stages of nursery development. Contact Jeremy for further information.
